Garden Lecture at Garland Farm

The Subject Was Flowers Eudora Welty's Garden

The Beatrix Farrand Society will host Jane Roy Brown at 1:00-3:00 pm on Wednesday, August 15, at Garland Farm. Brown will present "The Subject Was Flowers", based on *One Writer's Garden: Eudora Welty's Home Place*, coauthored by garden historian Brown and Susan Haltom.

Eudora Welty (1909-2001), who won the Pulitzer Prize for *The Optimist's Daughter*, was a prolific and gifted writer of novels and short stories about the American South. Her stories contain many images of flowers and gardens – these originated in her passionate connection to her home garden in Jackson, Mississippi. Welty's mother created this garden in the 1920s and thought of it as a place to learn. Welty used it as a place to dream, and as a source of inspiration and renewal. Brown's story of Welty, her garden, and its restoration near the end of her life, are a source of inspiration and renewal for all of us.

Brown's book, One Writer's Garden, will be available for sale, and she will sign copies on site.

This event is open to the public. Cost is \$10 for members of the Beatrix Farrand Society, and \$20 for nonmembers, payable at the event. *Registration is limited and advance reservation is required*. To reserve seats, email programs@beatrixfarrandsociety.org or telephone 207-288-0237.

Garland Farm is located at 475 Bay View Drive, Bar Harbor ME. *From the island bridge*, drive east on Route 3 toward Bar Harbor, approximately two miles. Turn left on Bay View Drive, then immediately turn left into the parking area. Follow the footpath to the barn. *From downtown Bar Harbor*, travel north on Route 3, passing Hadley Point Road (about 7 miles). Continue past the Eden Village Motel & Cottages. In .2 miles, turn right on Bay View Drive, then immediately left into the parking area. Accessible parking is available with advance notice; please call 207-288-0237.
